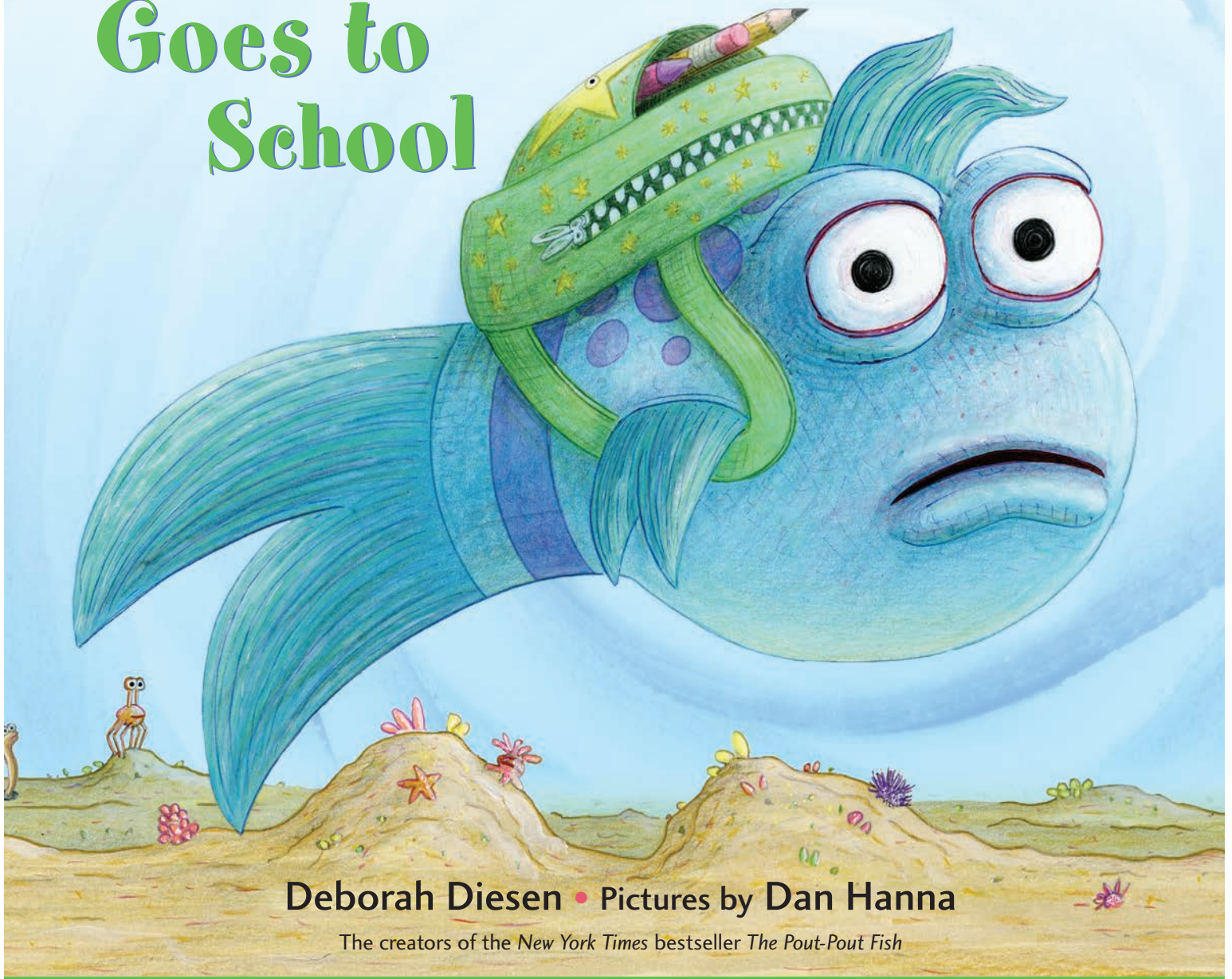

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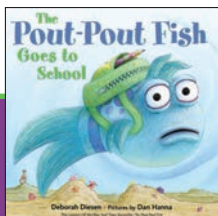


Drawing Activity

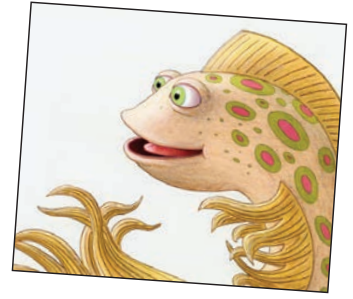
Encourage students to think about what takes away their pouts!

Rhyming Activity



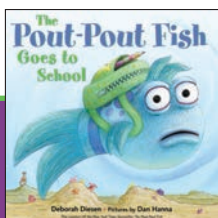
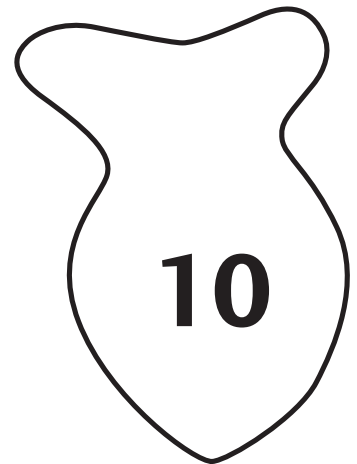
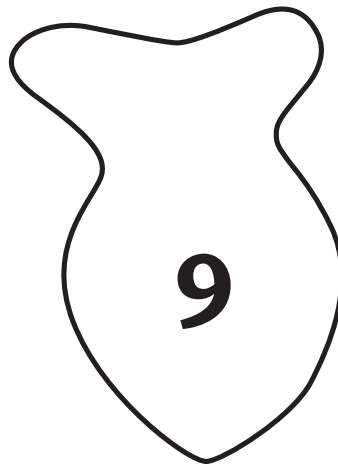
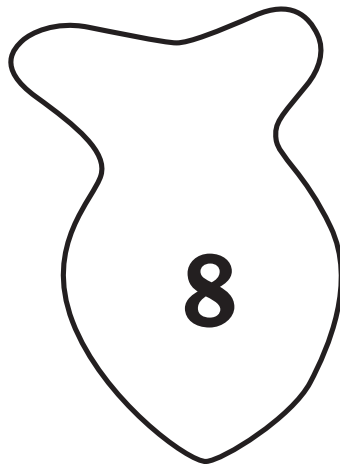
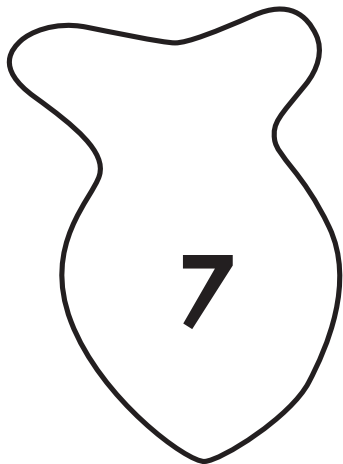
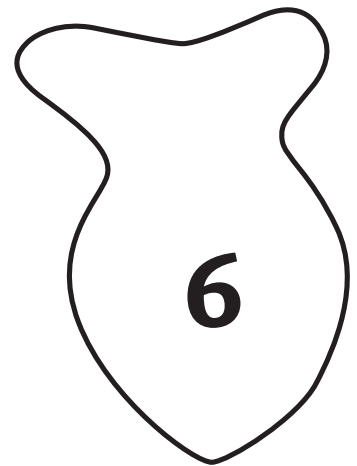
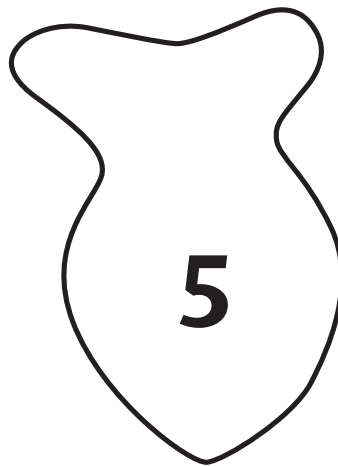
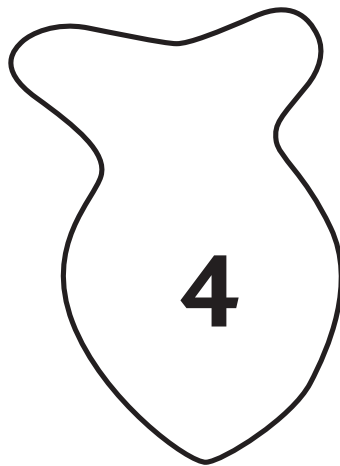
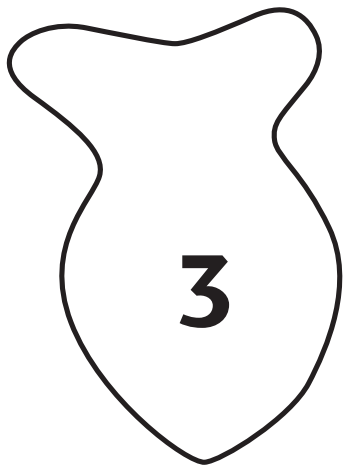
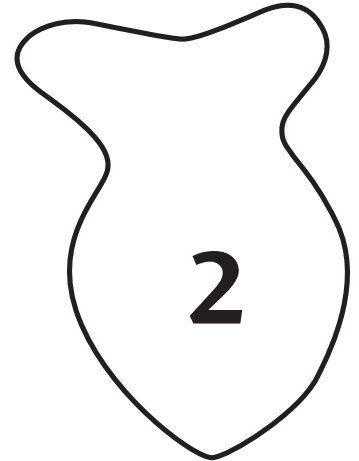
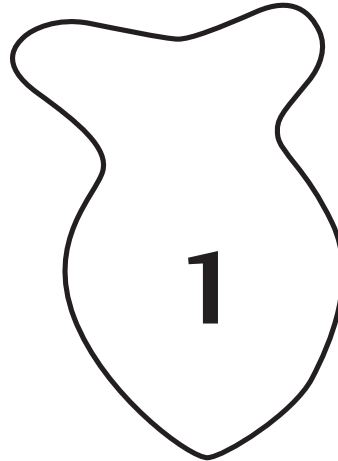

Counting Activity



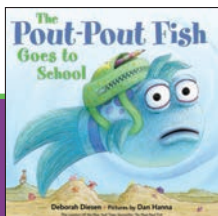
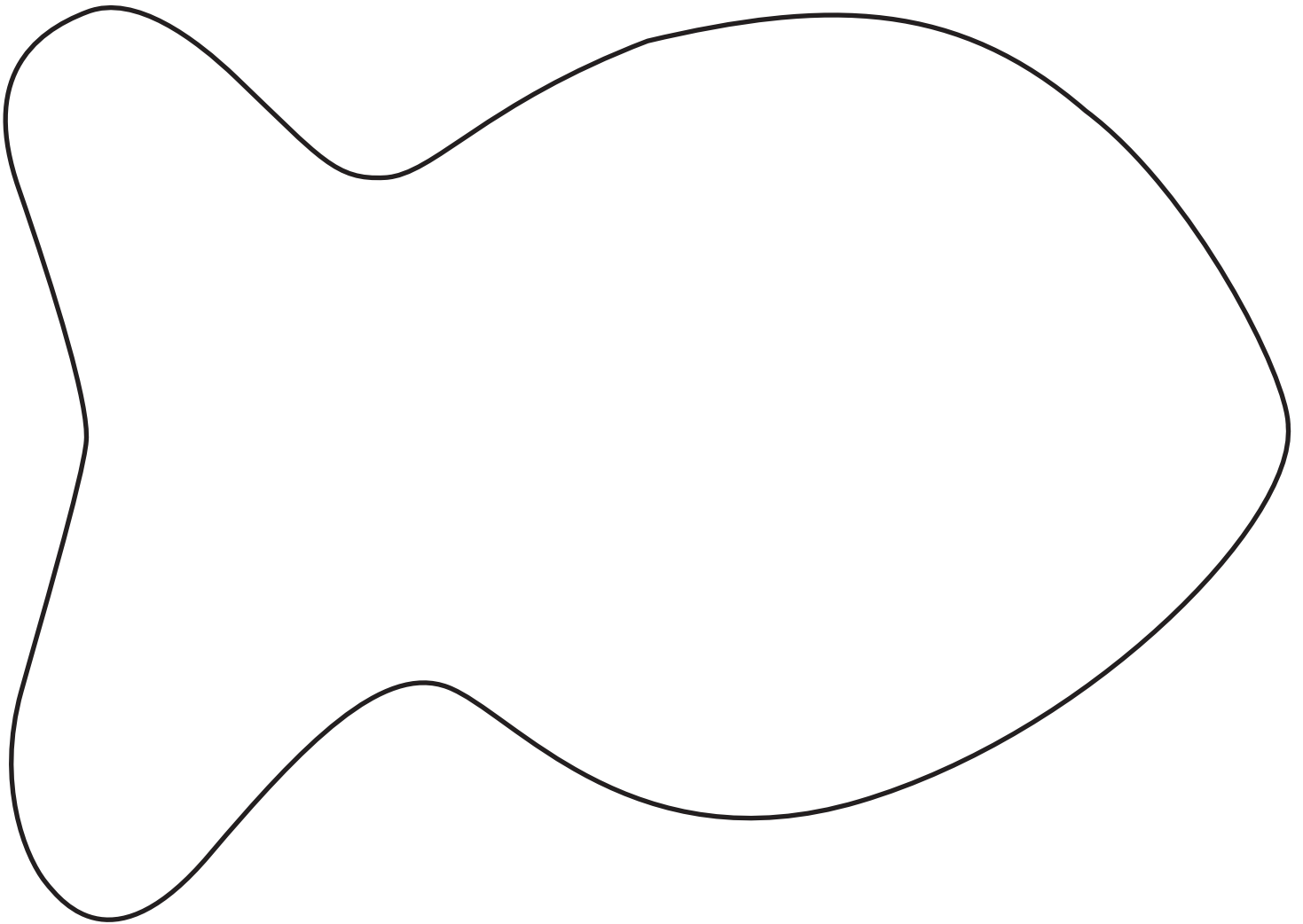
- Attach a piece of string or yarn to a stick or dowel to make a fishing pole, and tie a strong magnet to the loose end of the string.
- Color the fish shapes below and cut them out. Laminate them, and add a paper clip by the mouth of each.
- Laying all the fish on the floor, have students “go fishing” with the magnet fishing pole. Each time they catch a fish, ask them to say what number is on it. This game can also be adapted into a fun way to teach simple addition or subtraction to older students.



Ocean Coloring Activity

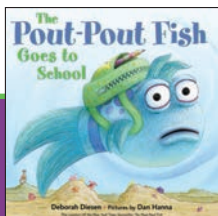

Then, design a bulletin board to look like an ocean to display the entire school of fish for your classroom!



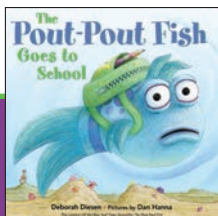
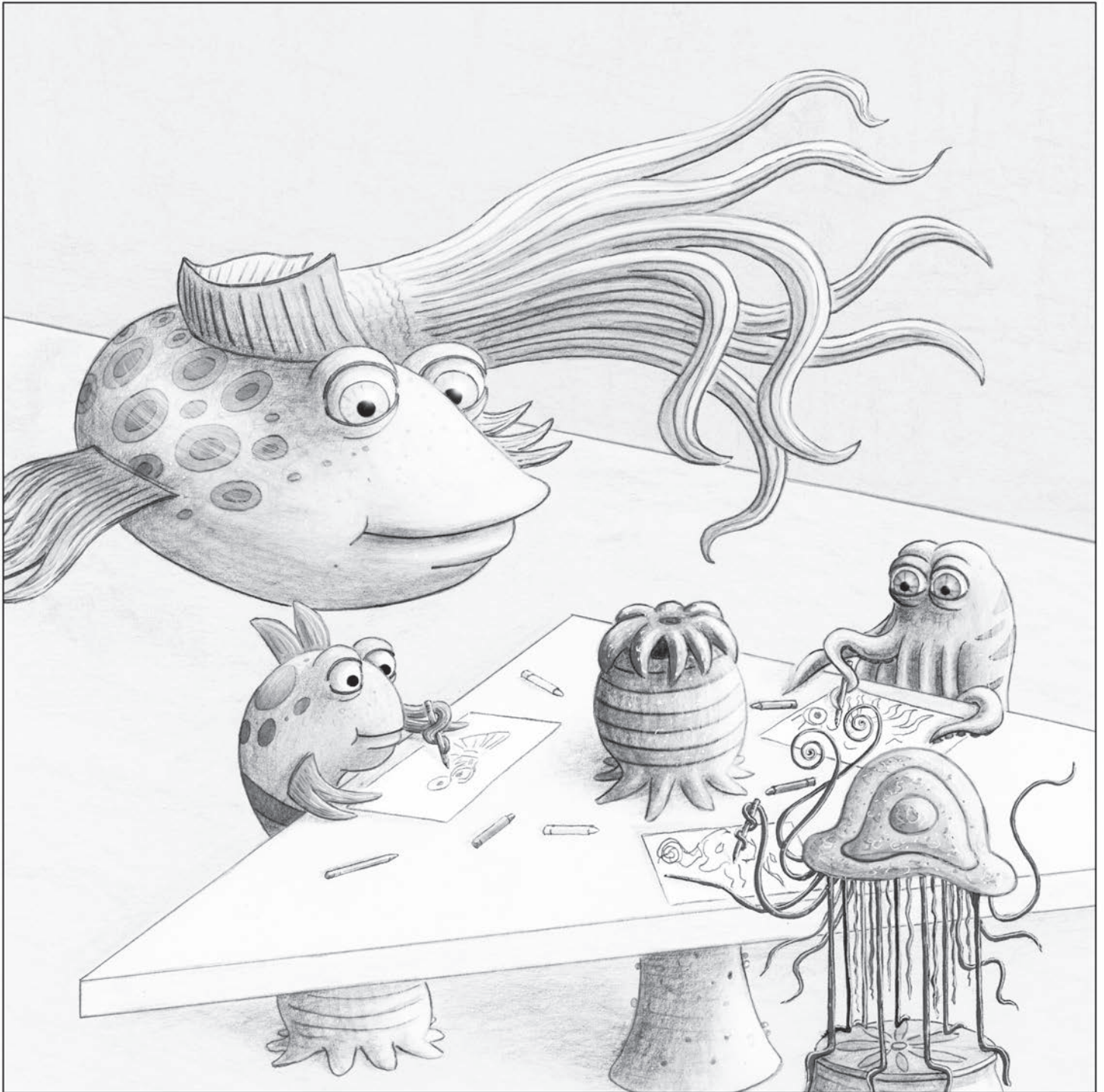
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
